#### **UAC INTBDR**

Stephen Zuzz Day (with apologies to Rosser) was a quiet day, more reserved than usual, given the need for an early start on the It's Not The Boxing Day Rally, and for very good cause. A strong black coffee, the load secured and checked, and we (*Paddy Lombard and his brother, John - Ed.*) were on the road by 4.30 am the next morning, arriving at Edenmore Golf Club soon after 6.30am where already it was "all systems go".

The scrutineers were working at full pace, and soon we were passed, checked in at HQ and working our way through the NTBD Road & Test Books. The temptation of a hot breakfast was too much to resist, so we tucked in, while picking up some useful tips from Arthur McMullan, pilot of Anglia 105E fame.

This is a very popular event and getting your entry in early was vital. By 7 pm on the first day it opened for entries, the full quota of 140 had been received, over 60 of which were MX-5s. A good mix of MR2s, Midgets, Starlets, Escorts and Minis were also included in the large line up. A sight for sore eyes was the Frogeye Sprite of



Andy & Heather Johnson, which provided some welcome variety.

With such a large entry, the field was split into two groups and soon after 9.30, we followed the tulip instructions to the first test.

The menu consisted of twelve tests run over two laps, leaving from Edenmore Golf Club, with locations spread from the Moira area northwards to Crumlin and back via Dundrod, White Mountain and Hillsborough.

Hasleys Town Lane was our first challenge. The low-lying start was waterlogged and we watched as one MX5 crew almost immediately came to grief in this water feature - we proceeded with caution till clear of it.

#### 27th December

Whelan (Starlet) were best in Class 3. The other Dubliners Declan Furlong / Derek Beglan (Starlet) were quickest in Class 5.

Finlays Yard was next up - a clean open tarmac yard, followed by nearby Hallstown Farm, where 'Cow Poop and Muck' were marked obstacles on the test instructions. Soon there was cow poop and muck for most of this loose & slippy section. Damien Mooney /

tying for second, and Frank Lenehan (Starlet) and Robert Dickson (Mini) tying for fourth quickest. Robert and John were again best of the Class 3 contenders.

From muck to muck spreaders at Martins Supplies, conditions were slippy due to a low sun, and shaded icy sections. Farm machinery and shipping containers were on hand to punish you if you got it wrong. Damien was again best in class on this test, closely followed by Frank and Eamonn. Once again, the Whelan's had the fastest time in Class 3.

The Transport Training section was a quick open test on tarmac, while the nearby Dundrod Pits proved testing with a tight ice covered route through a maze of concrete bollards. Needless to say, post-event panel beating opportunities were availed of for some on this one. Sam Wilson scored a Class 1 first place on the Lap 1, only to be beaten into second by Paul Mooney on Lap 2. Eamonn and Frank tied for fourth. Both Whelans and Declan returned second places in their respective classes here.

Stoneyford Concrete is an essential part of the annual NTBD event, and as before, this short test was both fast and slippy, but at least in this case, free from the demon shaded ice. Steven Ferguson's autotesting skills came to the fore and he was best in Class 1. Tied for second were Frank, Damien, Sam & Paul.

Nearby Jordans Concrete was a combination of tight runs between stacked concrete blocks, and a rough field section, then to a fast partially shaded and icy section and, as the end of the test was in sight, through a series of bollards. We left our mark here, one of many to have done so, as was evidenced by the number of damaged wings to be seen by the end of the day! Steven & Sam tied for fastest on Lap 1, while Steven was fastest outright on Lap 2. Robert Whelan was best in Class 3 and third fastest overall.



The Hill View Farm test sheet warned us that it was 'Not To Scale'. Apart from the accurate representation of the start and the finish sections, everything in between was definitely not to scale. It was fast and loose and only vaguely resembled the test book sheet. Steep downhill, flat out, and near lift-off with a chicane looming is a sensation to savour! Paul Mooney scored fastest time on both laps here, with the Whelans and Declan scoring featuring prominently in their respective classes.

Greers Yard Test, known as the Christmas Tree test, was fast and open in a tarmac yard, which looked simple on the sheet. The front-runners were all very closely matched here.

Nearby Laws Transport Yard and Lagan Valley Steel are located adjacent to each other, both short, clean and fast, and regularly used for the NTBD event. There was sibling simultaneity with Paul and Damien Mooney best in Class 1, with the Whelans first in Class 3, and Gillian Coughlan / Colin Keegan (Colt) heading up Class 5.



Back at the Edenmore Golf Club, trailer loaded, a hot curry was the order of the day while we waited to see

the results sheet. We featured alright ..... albeit well down on page two! But for our first Lanes type rally, we were more than delighted with the long but super fun day out. A special word of thanks to the Ulster Automobile Club organisers, officials, and marshals in particular who earned their NTBD supper. Also worthy of mention are Peespeed and the other photographers whose efforts add to the experience.

#### Resumé of proceedings at committee meetings Dec 2017, Jan 2018

- The Christmas Autosolo at Holfeld's on 26th Dec with Eamonn & Daniel Byrne and Chris Grimes at the helm was declared a success. The tests were "loved" by the competitors. It was decided to have this event on 27th in 2018 to see if that might alleviate the "domestic difficulties" for drivers/marshals. Potential clash with UAC INTBDR might be an issue.
- The AGM, Club Championship Prizegiving and Table Quiz will probably now take place on 16th February 2018 in the DYMC. Richard Meeke has confirmed. Frank to approach John McCloskey re. refreshments. The Purty Kitchen fare last year was disappointing.
- Our extra Club Autotest for 11th March has been ratified. However it does clash with the RIAC National Classic Car Show in the RDS. It might compromise our input to this.
- Mark's MVAT on 28th January is "all systems go". Competitors to be reminded individually at sign-on not to abuse the "drive the tests carefully in advance" privilege, if, indeed, it is allowed on this occasion.

- The usual event format on the ground and administratively will be adopted.
- Piers was commended on his husbandry of the website. Kevin similarly for the Facebook page which he keeps ticking over.
- Stephen has again done a great job with the Club Championship. There was a discussion as to whether tweaks were needed for 2018. Apart maybe from looking at the RWD LSD handicap in PCTs it was decided to leave well alone. Stephen will contact all of the award winners and encourage them to come to the Prizegiving.
- There was a short debate about the Holfeld's event in April being an Autodsolo or MVAT. The former allows only one person in the car and one-day licences can be issued. A secondary consideration is that there is no reversing. MVATs do permit passengers but not one-day licences. Paul is to investigate the possibility that this latter restriction be waived when the MVAT takes place at a single location.



The idea is that you dismantle the shaver to get at the rotary cutters. You then put a






blob of "polish" on a small mirror and move the cutter in a circular motion until you get
